Interested in Social Studies ?

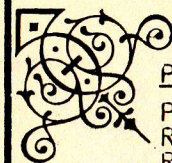

The Week That Was

Friday 27th September

The Friday of 'Jubilee Week' was designated 'Youth Day'. In the event, 'Youth Night' would have been nearer the mark. It began with a 'Liturgy For Young People' at 7.30 P.M. Young people participated in the Prayers of the Faithful, the Offertory Procession and in the Readings, as well as in the singing. It was attended by up to three hundred teenagers, some attentive and some restless. It was quite a night.

The Disco followed. Mount Mercy was the venue, again by kind permission of the Mercy Sisters. Over five hundred and fifty tickets were sold. A lively night followed. Lights flashed, the decibel level soared and a lot of those who came had a ball. Our pastor surveyed the scene, but declined all invitations to take the floor.

All the parishioners who attended behaved themselves admirably; it was the 'foreigners' who drew most attention to themselves. In the end, it passed off peacefully. The organisers were delighted with the takings. When expenses are paid, both the Parish Youth Club and the I.S.P.C.C. could find themselves over £ 120 better off. A sincere 'thank you' to all who helped out.

Saturday 28th September

The Mass in the Crypt on Saturday afternoon was a little bit of heaven here on earth. Over eighty people normally confined to quarters attended, due to the kind help of willing volunteers. The Junior Choir sang very sensitively and were greatly appreciated by the assembly. The three local priests concelebrated and incorporated the Sacrament of the Sick in the Mass. Father Tadhg preached, and reminded all to turn to Christ in the storms of life, as the disciples did in the boat. The Lord would never be far away from those who called on Him. Refreshments followed, accompanied by live piano music, and a most enjoyable experience was reported by all.

Sunday 29th September

The 'Oíche Ghaelach' was a night to end all nights. More pounds were lost on the dancefloor than at a day at the Races! Ballads were sung in sweet voice and beautiful music filled the GAA Clubhouse. The crowd was not massive, but very enthusiastic, and insisted on having a good time. It was a fitting end to a great week - we owe a great debt of gratitude to all who helped organize it. QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS.

*Who is giving the Novena ?

The Redemptorists, who are based in Limerick. A team of four will be spending the next two weeks in the parish. They are Frs. Tony Flannery, John Hanna, Pat Egan and Tom Flanagan.

*At what time will the sessions be on ?

There will be three sessions daily, at 10.00 A.M., 6.30 P.M. and 8.00 P.M. We hope there's a time there to suit everyone.

*Are Sundays different ?

In a word, no. There will be sessions at 10.00, 6.30 and at 8.00. In addition, all the usual Sunday Masses will be part of the Novena. (8.00, 9.00, 11.00 and 12.15)

*Does that mean any change in Mass times ?

Yes. For the duration of the Novena, from Saturday next to Sunday week, there will be no 7.30 PM Mass. Not even on Saturday evening.

*Who is the Novena for ?

Everyone. Men, women, teenagers and children. All parishioners are welcome and indeed invited to attend.

*What about confessions ?

They'll be freely available before and after each session of the Novena. There'll be plenty priests, both Redemptorists and local priests. We'll do our best to make sure that confession will be one of the high points of the week for you.

*Will our homes be visited ?

Yes indeed. All the homes of the parish will be visited within the next week. Your home may be visited by a missionary, or by one of the local priests or sisters. We hope to cover the entire parish between Monday and Friday of the coming week.

*What can I do ?

Come to the sessions, daily. Pray every day for the success of the Novena. And do as the motto of the Novena advises.....
...." OPEN YOUR HEART TO CHRIST".
