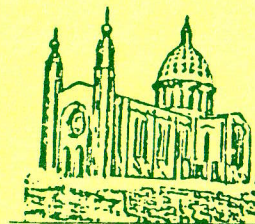

there is hope for us and for the world.

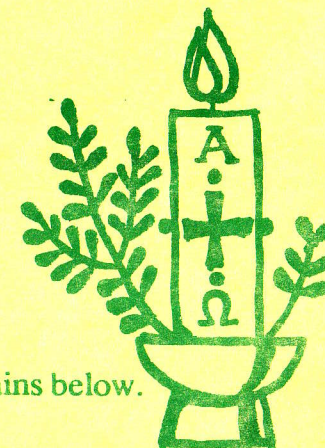
So, come my friends,

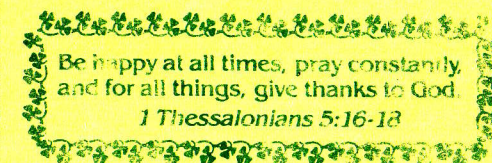
In fact, the Editor doubts whether it's solvable! Feel challenged now? Well, don't delay. Drop your entry in to 1 Woodlawn before Thursday next.
