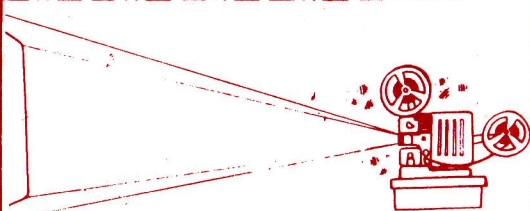

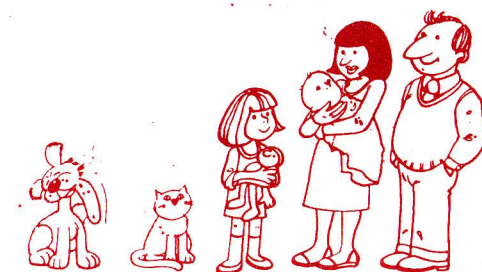


Back to the Future

Financial Report 1986 Part 2

Pat & Rita Shaw took over the running of the Booklets in the Church in Feb. 1986. The sales then were approx. 45 Booklets per month. In Sept. the side-door rack was resited within the Church and a new one was placed inside the main doors. Sales then rose to approx. 90 Booklets per month, with one glorious "high" of 123 in Nov. A total of 673 were sold between Feb. & Dec. inclusive. The titles ranged over a very wide spectrum, i.e. Our Lord, Holy Spirit, The Mass, Our Lady, Sacraments, The Family and Children, The Saints, Prayer etc. with Social & Moral Questions topping the list. The people of the Parish are to be congratulated on the amount and quality of their reading. Keep up the good work! A plea for helpers was answered by Stella Barry, Woodlawn and Terry Layton, whose work is greatly appreciated. The group now appeals for a young married couple and a young girl and boy to join them, in order to reap the benefit of their enthusiasm and their youthful advice on the future purchasing of Booklets.

The racks are being run at a loss, as some Booklets are being taken without payment. We do not wish to make a profit, but merely wish to keep "ticking over".
