Parish Activities

HERE ARE our suggestions for the running of the Parish Pastoral Council until a Constitution is drawn up.

OBJECTIVES:

Under the patronage of the Holy Spirit; to create a Parish Community centred on Jesus, where people find a sense of belonging and support; to develop the parish as a caring community of service, where the giftedness and ministry of each individual is realised and valued.

MEMBERSHIP:

Seventeen to Twenty Members.

One to be elected from each of the following areas:-

- 1) Farranlea Area (140 houses)
- 2) Model Farm Road/Woodlawn/Cherrygrove (128 houses)
- 3) Kenley (115 houses)
- 4) Parkway/Woodford/Wyndwood (117)
- 5) Leesdale (140 houses)
- 6) Bishopscourt (126 houses)
- 7) Bishopstown Ave/Highfield/Woodleigh (124 houses)
- 8) Laburnum/The Ridgeway (104)
- 9) Wilton Gardens (90 houses)
- 10) Wilton Road (90 houses)
- 11) North of Magazine Road including Bendemeer Pk. (150)
- 12) South of Magazine Rd. including Lima Lawn (140)

PLUS the five Parish Team members
PLUS the possibility of co-opting three members, to correct imbalance in age, sex, interest group or category. (Co-opted by a majority of the Council)

Financial Report 1986 Part 4

NO DOUBT you were relieved to see the scaffolding removed from the rear of the Church within the past few weeks. It signalled the completion of the work on the copper roof. The long drawn-out process was, for the most part, caused by unfavourable weather - apparently the work can proceed only in certain climatic conditions. The point of most concern naturally is whether you will be asked to pay more for this when the final account is submitted. Happily the answer is no. Our Parish had on the 1st. May a credit balance of £11,121.01 which should meet the final payment on the roof plus the school capitation grants for all primary school children in our parish - a sum of about £3,500.00 - due before 31st. May. Hopefully we will improve the quality of our lighting system in the Church in the foreseeable future and this will entail a considerable expenditure on the part of the Parish. We have no definite figures, but when we have we will let you have all the facts. Finally your continued generosity each Sunday ensures that all these extra and heavy items of expenditure can be met from your regular Sunday offerings. A very sincere thanks to all.
