IRISH COMMISSION FOR THE LAITY

I attended the quarterly meeting of the Irish Commission for the Laity in Dublin on June 6.

In a very full day the two main topics were 'Life in a Multi-cultural Society' and 'The Formation of Priests in the Circumstances of the Present Day'.

As part of the Irish delegations' contribution to the European Forum of National Laity Committees, to take place in Antwerp, it was decided to study the place of Travelling People in Ireland.

Nell McDonagh and her husband Michael, both Travellers, spoke to us passionately about themselves, their families and the travelling people in general. They spoke of their wish to be recognised as a distinct ethnic group; how they crave education; how hurt they are by discrimination; how frustrated they are by not being listened to.

Their plea? To be consulted on matters of education, housing, halting sites, the provision of facilities like water and toilets. An end to discrimination. To be helped to learn new skills. To become literate.

Fr. Tom Corbett spoke of the role of the priest in today's world. He spoke of the Church's sense of mystery, celebrated in the Eucharist but acted out with a sense of mission, not inward-looking.

The priest must make Christ alive in the community he serves, in obedience to Christ, in chastity, in poverty. He spoke of the need of priests, indeed of all of us, not to flaunt the world's goods. These possessions should, he said, be subjected to the love of God.

Our day ended with a Eucharist.
