

Are our leaders, politicians, professionals, business people so perfect that they cannot, through error or human frailty or plain greed go beyond what is decent and acceptable?


I am not impressed by their performance and the hope of peace in our country and the posturing that we are witnessing does not deflect me from my concern for our country's future.
