

The Dean writes

FR. GOOD WAS NOT "BANISHED" TO TURKANA

It was nice to read of so much support for my good friend and one-time brilliant class fellow, Fr. Jim Good, in recent issues of the Bulletin and elsewhere. Marjorie Morgan asked a very pertinent question in last week's issue - "Who on earth is stopping him coming back to Cork?" The simple answer is - Nobody.

I know the late Bishop Murphy invited Fr. Jim to return to Cork very shortly after he took over as Bishop. Bishop Buckley has said publicly he would welcome him with open arms and - as far as I know - Bishop Lucey invited him back before he retired.

Fr. Good was not "banished" to Turkana - he went as a volunteer missionary, and, as everybody knows, Bishop Lucey joined him there as a simple volunteer missioner after his retirement in Cork. The relationship between these two men was based on a very sincere friendship - I recall receiving letters from Bishop Lucey in Turkana where he wrote: "Jim Good has been a wonderful friend to me Since I came here."

I remember too the bishop insisting that Fr. Good take his car for his holiday here.

One further point - it was not Bishop Lucey who ordered Jim Good out of the Diocese when he went to Linerick - he went there at the request of U.C.C. to set up a new Education faculty there. He lived there with the Redemptorist fathers - and they said - he was the best Redemptorist in the house!!

Finally, what was the point at issue in the recent programme in I na G? As far as I know (I stress this), the original withdrawal of faculties was never formalised in writing - so nobody thought of erasing it.
