If it's to mean anything, Lent must be a challenging time. Looking around at the problems of the world, it's so easy to cop out by saying – I don't understand international politics, I don't understand trading policies, I don't understand fixed pricing by large multinationals, I don't understand......

Very few of us do. But we know that the producers of coffee in many parts of the world cannot get a price for their crop which even remotely reflects the shop price. Banana growers in many places would almost prefer to let their crop rot rather than be exploited and told: 'Take it or leave it'.

Fair Trade Fortnight has begun. The Fair Trade identity mark on products guarantees: a just price, sound crop management, care for the producers. As a Parish, we believe in promoting Justice for Third World Producers.

- ◆ From now on all tea products in O'Brien's Sandwich Bars will be Fairtrade sourced. Recently all of the 38 Timepiece restaurants in Dunnes Stores have switched to Fairtrade.
- ◆ Fairtrade rice and wine products are being launched as part of Fairtrade Fortnight 2006.
- ◆There are now five Fairtrade cities in Ireland: Belfast, Cork, Galway, Kilkenny and Waterford; and three Fairtrade towns: Kinsale, Thurles, and Clonakilty.
- ◆The Croke Park Stadium Management Company has agreed to stock Fairtrade coffee and tea in some outlets in the stadium.
