## LET'S DIG DEEP FOR TURKWEL!



Suppose that, instead of belonging to Holy Spirit Parish, Dennehy's Cross, you live in Turkwel parish, northern Kenya, what is life like for you?

You live in semi-desert, where there is no rain for 9 months of the year; the earth is scorched. You try to provide for your family probably by herding goats, or, if you could get access to water, by growing corn or sweet potato. You live in fear of raiding parties from across the Sudanese border. With recurrent and prolonged drought, water and food supply is very uncertain. You and your children are chronically malnourished and often ill – with malaria, typhoid, TB, AIDS... Your children find it difficult to learn, even with access to education. Your parish priest is Fr. Ollie Noonan, a Corkonian, assisted by his curate, Fr. Edward Muge, a Nigerian, both SMA Fathers.

As a relatively well-off parish in Ireland, we can share some of what we have with the people of Turkwel parish, as part of our ongoing "Faith in Action" activities, and to celebrate the 150 years of the SMA Order. There will be a Special Church Door Collection on the weekend of the 27/28<sup>th</sup> May which will go directly and entirely to the Turkwel Irrigation Scheme Association: a local cooperative of 300 farmers, in which Fr. Ollie is fully involved. Our target (their need) is €8,035, which, together with the work contributed by the farmers themselves, will enable a system of wells and irrigation channels to be built, providing clean water for home use as well as for farming. For them water means life.

**So make a note: 27/28<sup>th</sup> May – and come prepared to share!**

### A TURNCOAT CONVERT

In Irish politics there has always been a time of distrust about the activist who switches parties. There is an implication that it must be for self gain. Real conversion is rarely seen to be a possibility. When Saul, later called Paul, switched from hounding the early Christians and having them imprisoned, to preaching boldly that Jesus was indeed risen from the dead, it was inevitable that he would run into stiff opposition. In fact, it was the Hellenists – the early Christians who had not been traditional Jews – who tried to silence him by killing him. It was an extreme solution.

Saul was lucky in his friends. One of them, Barnabas, an able and respected disciple, had Saul spirited away to Tarsus until things cooled down. In fact, he set Paul up to do his great work for the church overseas later. This weekend's first reading tells the story more fully.
