Fairtrade Fortnight 2007 (26 Feb - 11 Mar)



During Fairtrade Fortnight there is a special focus on the Fairtrade movement nationally. It is an opportunity to take stock of

- new Fairtrade products on the market;
- shops, cafes and restaurants, which are using Fairtrade products;
- whether each of us, as an individual, is buying products which we know to be fairly traded;
- whether we are using our strength as consumers to influence ethical trading. The consequences of our choices are far-reaching, ensuring that the Third World producers have a future for themselves and their families, and that the goods are produced in a manner which is sustainable.


As a Fairtrade Parish (Ireland's first) we plan to hold a Fairtrade display in the Crypt on the weekend of March 3rd and 4th, with refreshments and competitions. You will be surprised at the variety of goods now available, which carry the Fairtrade Mark: not just foods, but also clothing, ornaments. So note the dates in your diary! When we pray together it makes us aware of ourselves as participating members of the Church community.

A sacred place in the home will help us to become aware of the presence of God. It will encourage us to talk to Him and listen to Him speak to us in the silence of our own hearts. This sacred place can be a corner with a candle. God is the source of life and the candle symbolises light and life. The candle will act as a symbol within the home of the God who is everywhere, who is always there for us and who is inviting us into communication with Him.

A further aid to the formation of a good prayer habit would be to set aside a time for prayer. Pick a time that suits you. Maybe when the Angelus bell rings, before a meal, or before bedtime could become your daily prayer time.

David was on the run with Saul in pursuit. Indeed, Saul had several near misses in his attempts to kill his son-in-law David. In this weekend's reading, the tables are completely overturned. David has a perfect opportunity to kill Saul. Even for his own safety he must surely take this opportunity. He does not. Instead, he spares Saul's life and offers him the hand of reconciliation and friendship.

A great spirit of generosity towards others inspires David. The welfare of another takes precedent over his own. The story is recalled this weekend as a concrete human prelude to the teaching of Jesus in the gospel. It could challenge each of us to have a David moment or even to live as Jesus calls us to do.
