

OUR PARISH PRIEST WRITES

YEAR OF VOCATION -APRIL 2008 TO MAY 2009



For the twelve months between this Sunday the 13th of April, Vocations Sunday, and the 3rd of May 2009, Vocations Sunday, every effort will be made to raise awareness of the common vocation we all share through Baptism as expressed in witness, love and service. There is a special dignity attached to each vocation: married and family life, ordained priesthood, religious life and the single life.

Vocation to religious life and priesthood has reached crisis stage in Ireland and other European countries. While the numbers of students studying for the priesthood worldwide is at an all-time high, the crisis still deepens in our own country. On Friday 1st February, the Pope spoke to the students of Rome's Major Seminary: "Because the gift of being adoptive children of God has illuminated your lives," the Pope told the seminarians, "you have felt the desire to share this with others. This is why you are here, to develop your vocation and prepare yourselves for your future mission as apostles of Christ."

In his address to the parents of the seminarians, the Pope said, "You are probably the most surprised of all about what has happened and is happening to your children. You had perhaps imagined for them a mission different from the one for which they are now preparing. Look to Mary. The Gospel helps us to understand that she too asked herself many questions about her son Jesus, and reflected on him for a long time."

"It is inevitable that the vocation of children in some way also becomes the vocation of the parents," the Pope added. "Indeed, although it may appear that a priest's life does not attract the interest of the majority of people, in reality it is the most interesting of adventures and the most necessary for the world. It is a very demanding adventure and could not be otherwise because a priest is called to imitate Jesus."

Offering a final word of encouragement, Pope Benedict said: "Follow your journey at the seminary with your hearts open to truth, to transparency and to dialogue with those who guide you and this will help you to respond simply and humbly to the One who calls you, freeing yourselves from the risk of pursuing a personal project of your own."

WHO WILL LEAD US?

Jesus was the great storyteller. The Good Samaritan and the Prodigal Son evoke a response whenever they are told. The image of Christ as the Good herd is not quite so universal or so enduring. In this part of the world, we are more accustomed to drovers than to shepherds. Drovers goad from behind with the stick. Shepherds lead in the front with trust, confidence and al relationship. And yet, for the people of his own time and place, the image of shepherd enabled Christ to point out that his role was to lead people to the Father, to point the way to what is best. It is a role that he handed on in a particular way to the bishops and priests of every age.

Jesus saw this leadership role as crucially important among his people. It is even more important today. Genuine leadership towards God and the things of God is what we pray for today as we listen to this weekend's gospel with open hearts. Who is open to such a relationship with Jesus and his people?
