STRENGTH FROM THE RESURRECTION



Circus stunt men can perform wonderful feats in the course of their work. One such was a gentleman by the name of Charlie Maher. He pushed a wheelbarrow on a wire across a 200 feet gorge before a huge crowd of spectators. You could hear your heart beating in the silence during the push. On his arrival at the far end a huge cheer went up from the crowd - a relief for themselves as much as acclamation for Charlie. A young man rushed up to the artist, shook his hand saying, "You really can do anything". "Do you believe this?" said Charlie. "Yes, I really do" said the young man. "Very well then", said Charlie addressing the crowd. "I will take the wheelbarrow back across the gorge now with this young man sitting in it." When he looked around of course the young man was nowhere to be seen.

Our faith in the Resurrection on a bright sunny Easter Sunday morning when everything is right in the world is one thing. The demands on our faith in darker days is quite anther thing. The reality of a marriage break-up, a job lost, debts mounting, can bring serious pressures. What then? Faith in the Resurrection is not a magical cure-all. But it does give us a new perspective, and courage to face life as it is, to confront the pain of serious illness, perhaps personal failure, or loss of a loved one.

Faith is about saying - I believe in the sun even when it's not shining - I believe in love when everything in the world is dark and I am alone - I believe in God even when he is silent.

The Apostles went into hiding after the awful events of Good Friday. We can lose heart when life goes against us too. The Risen Christ empowers us to face reality, and the hand that life deals us. He is a reassuring presence, a quiet strength - a secure harbour out of which we can learn to face life in all its difficulties - even if we may not accept an offer of a spin in a wheelbarrow on a wire.

Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.
