It is now clear that the years ahead are going to be difficult ones for everybody and extremely difficult for very many. The dominant inclination may be to focus exclusively on what will protect me and mine; what I have I hold and what I can grab I will.


Do not waste energy on cursing the darkness, but light a candle of joyful goodness each day.

Lectio Divina or "Divine Reading"

This is an ancient practice dating back to the early Church, to the desert people and monastic communities, such as that founded by St. Benedict. Literally it means divine reading, biblical spiritual reading or a holy reading. The purpose is to promote communion with God and increase knowledge of God's word. The classic four steps or phases help you to pray, study, and ponder the scriptures. You need to set aside an hour of time, a specific place, and preparation using the following steps:

- ♦ Lectio: reading
- ♦ Meditatio: meditation
- ♦ Oratio: prayer
- ♦ Contemplation: contemplation
