God's Word

Readings for Sunday

Acts 2:42-47

Psalms: 117

Second Reading:
1 Peter: 1: 3-9

Gospel:
Jn 20: 19-31

In this Sunday's Gospel, we have the evidence of Mary of Magdala and Peter and John that the tomb was empty. The empty tomb became the symbol for Easter, as the Crib was for Christmas. We tend to spend more time meditating the Crib than we do the empty tomb. At Easter we are invited to meditate on the Resurrection as we do in the First Glorious Mystery. Mary will take us to a deeper level of understanding the mystery if we accept her as our teacher.

The disciples on the road to Emmaus were going home, Peter and the others were going fishing, back to work. But they met the Risen Jesus and He changed everything. Thomas couldn't believe until he saw. Our faith depends on us experiencing the Risen Jesus and we can meet Him at Mass, in His word, in the people around us and indeed within ourselves. Can we give ourselves a little time, a little silence and reflection so that we too may be able to celebrate and say "Christ is truly risen, Alleluia". It may become infectious.

May you and yours have a blessed Easter.


