IF JESUS IS NOT RISEN

To be able and willing to believe in Resurrection is an enormous blessing. November is an opportunity to ask for this blessing for ourselves and for one another. It is a time to celebrate and nourish this belief. Memorial services in churches, graveyards, schools, hospitals, social clubs and in our homes show that there is a widespread appreciation that the bonds that link us together in life do not unravel at death.



These communal remembrances show our thanks to those who have given us life and shared life and faith with us. They highlight our longing and our hope of being reunited with those we have loved. These occasions can ease the human pain of loss and may heal hurts of failed relationships if we allow this to happen.

Hope of Resurrection is much more than significant human therapy. It is the profound reality that we will live together in the heart of God forever. It is only through faith that we can be in contact with that reality. The cornerstone of that reality is Jesus, whom the Father raised from the dead through the power of the Holy Spirit. This same Holy Spirit lives in us through Baptism and binds us inextricably with the Risen Jesus.

Such faith in Resurrection is pure gift and needs to be prayed for and celebrated. Cogent arguments may enrich the mind but can never change the heart. This faith comes as a blessing from God and is often nurtured through contact with fellow believers who live life with forgiving hearts. To live forgiveness is to prepare for Resurrection. Only a forgiving heart can live forever with a merciful God. To live like God now is the beginning of Resurrection.

"I believe in the communion of Saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and life everlasting".

Lord, help the little faith we have.
