The Sign

I remember offering my First Mass on Trinity Sunday. Easter was later that year and it follows that Trinity Sunday is the week after Pentecost. It's not an easy occasion to preach; for one thing it is a mystery, a teaching of the Church, and for another, there is actually no mention of the mystery of the Trinity in the Scriptures. But there is the last words of Jesus before he leaves this earth...".baptise them in the name of the father and the son and the holy spirit, and know that I am with you always, even to the end of the world"...the sign of the cross.

When I bless myself, what happens? I put my hand to my forehead, then to my middle, and end with my two shoulders. It is a very physical act and I am calling on heaven to bless my entire being, not just my body but my whole life. I can learn to do it even as a child, and carry that act with me to the end. We call it the sign, making the Sign of the Cross. It's in the name of the Father and calls upon the fullness of God to fill our life and our day. It marks a beginning of things, it draws us together and helps us to focus, and it draws us to a close. .

And so we are on the road to discovery of God as a mystery but with Jesus who has a face, a voice and feelings, and who, with the Spirit has a force, a breathing presence. The apostles discovered their courage and their energy when they were gifted by the Spirit. So, in the conspiring of the three persons, they bring us into the heart of the Christian way of life. This is a sign that at long last we can say we are sons and daughters who have a share in the inheritance. It's as if we have discovered we belong to a whole new family.

With that sign of the Cross, we will want to learn more about that new family, learn from each other, and rejoice in each other's company. With love we will journey together, and when we take that road in mutual sharing and respect, we are assured of a blessed destination. That is the Gospel at work, that is the sign.
