Personal **Independence** (especially financial independence) is fast becoming the apex of achievement in our rapidly changing world. To have more than one's peers and to be exclusive is the goal of life for some people.

Yet, the cornerstone of permanent peace and happiness is **Interdependence.** "Ar scath a cheile, a mhaireann na daoine", says the shean fhocal. The human spirit yearns for and is fulfilled by stable enduring relationships that can blossom into love.

For those whom the opportunity arises, commitment to life long marriage can be an enduring gift from God. It is an ideal that is not always reached with our limited human nature and God understands that better than we do ourselves. His love for each of us never wavers.

The subtle malaise of our time is that the ideal itself is being rubbished as not being worthy of independent modern lifestyles.

Such an attitude is similar to that of the Pharisees in this weekend's Gospel. The Pharisees (all male) claimed that their law gave a man the right to change his wife whenever it suited him. The woman had no such right. When asked for his opinion, Jesus quickly turned the trick question on themselves. Do they want women to have the right to divorce? He goes on to highlight that human sexuality is a gift from God to enrich human love. It is to be protected, treasured and enjoyed. God's love embraces, enriches and blesses every fruitful friendship of loving care, shared kindness and joyful hope.

We give thanks for all His enduring gifts. May He enlighten our minds and hearts to appreciate them more deeply each day.
