Changing Times

I was saddened to hear that Mount Melleray, the Cistercian Monastery, has come to the end of its time. Many of us have visited there over the years. I remember they worked a farm, made their own bread and were a welcoming community. Many a hill walker, scout group or searching soul, found hospitality there. It reminds me also of the loss of Ennismore, the Dominican Retreat House here in Cork which closed its doors the last day of 2022. They were a very fine community exploring the Scriptures with us and were very helpful to me in my previous parish. When places like that close we are also witnessing the darkening of the light they shone. Ennismore was very strong on the power of Meditation as a means of being spiritually present in the silence and the stillness, a practice now imitated in the secular world by mindfulness. The new community to be formed out of Mount Melleray will be known as Our Lady of Silence.

For centuries before the birth of Christ the Jewish people lived with silence. No prophet, no message, no encouragement, had emerged for years. The atmosphere in the Holy Land was very clearly described by Father Tom in last week's Bulletin. This weekend, however, the silence is broken, four voices can be heard encouraging people not to give up, to imagine a good future, to throw away sorrow and distress. In particular the Psalm brings out the lovely images of a people returning from exile bringing a harvest of joy. Although they repeat last weeks dreary messages to change our ways, this time it is loving and encouraging, good things will come of it. " I am confident", Paul says," that the one who began the good work in you will continue to complete it until the day of Christ Jesus".

May these words encourage all who must change, including our own diocese indeed, in the circumstances of life.
