Candle light

This Sunday, February 2nd marks 40 days since Christmas. The figure 40 represents a time of preparation and transition; 40 years in the Book of Exodus marked the Exile and represents the change from slavery to freedom, Moses spent 40 days on Mount Horeb before emerging with the Ten Commandments, Jesus himself spent 40 days in the wilderness being tempted. These 40 days have passed since the birth of the Child Messiah and now is the time to present him to God in the temple. In many European countries, the cribs or Nativity scenes are only taken down now. If you visit Italy, Germany, Spain or Poland, the churches and individual homes would still display the Saviour's birth until now; even with all the trees and lights already removed. This weekend we celebrate the recognition of the Messiah child as the light of the world by two elderly holy people in the temple who had waited for this day. They can leave the world now; they have seen the light. The candles (originally this day was called Candlemas) represent Jesus as the light of the world and our own baptism as carriers of that light. The candles we bless are for our homes into which this light is now brought. In our own Baptism we are like the child Messiah this weekend, presented to the Lord. One more celebration marks this weekend: Day of Celebration for all who live a Consecrated Life. Thus we acknowledge the Sisters of Mercy and the Poor Clare Sisters in this parish, as well as those who, individually or in community, consecrate their lives to God. Let us light a candle this weekend for all these people, for people in our lives that need help, healing and encouragement, for ourselves as we navigate the road of life, for the procession of sorrow and loss in the troubled places of our country and our world.
